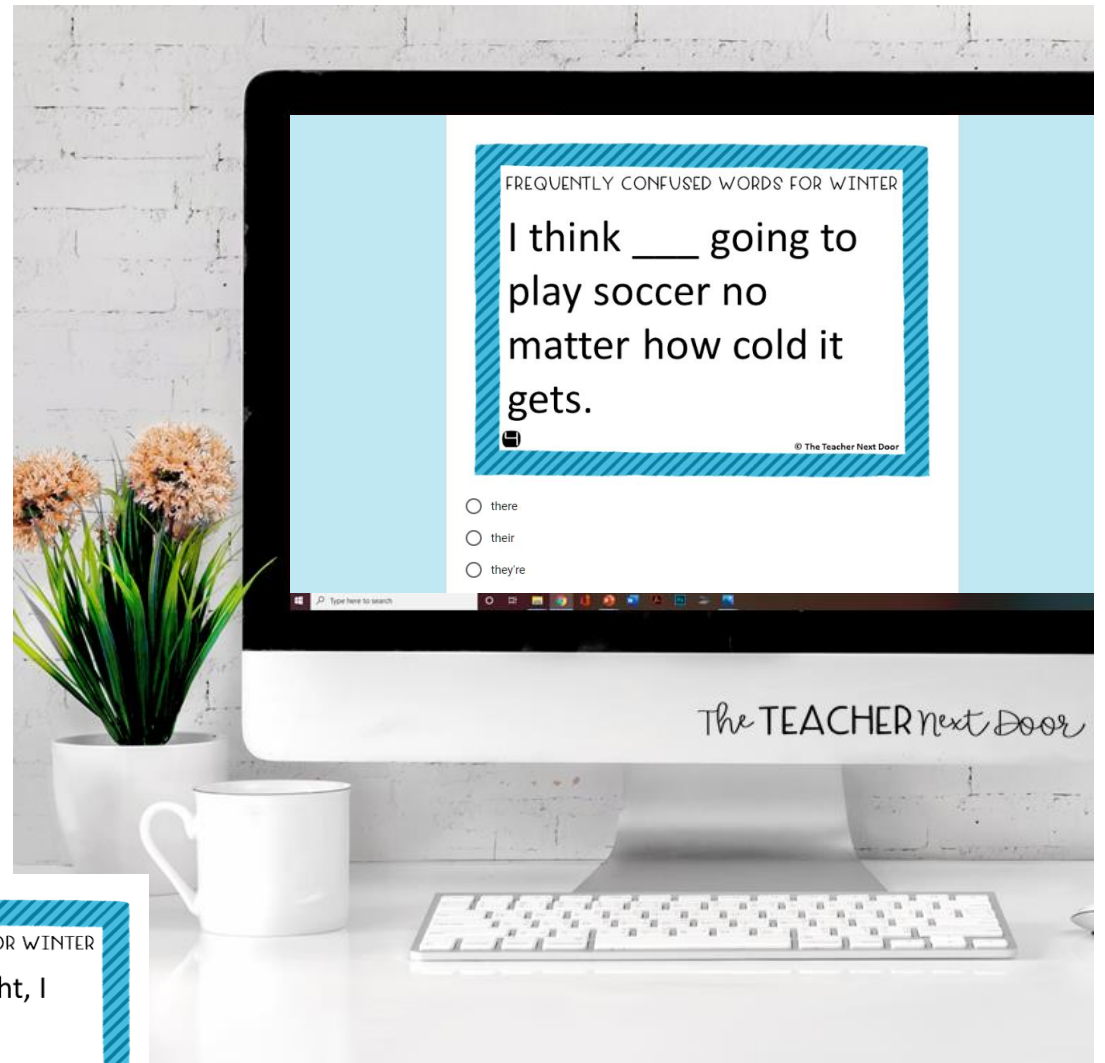

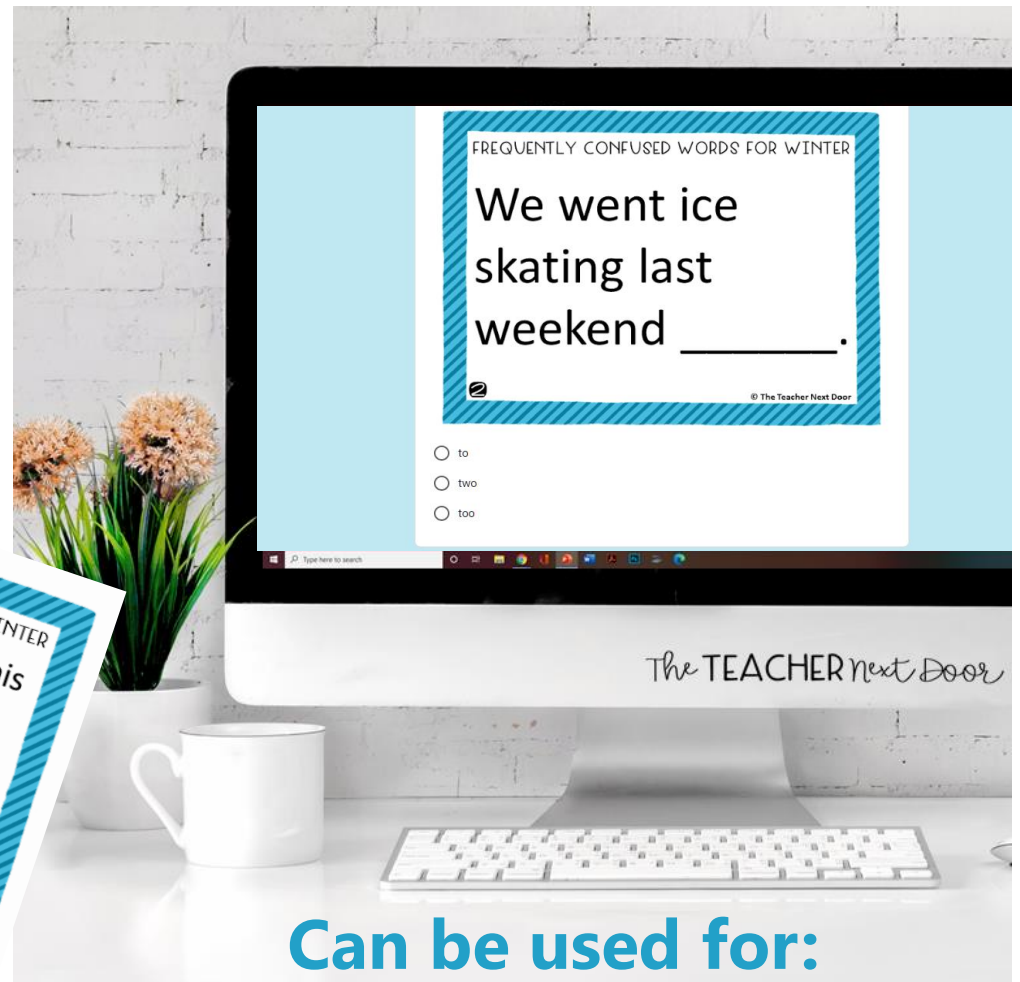

Polar Bears
Polar bears are found in the Arctic, in countries like Canada, Russia, Norway, Greenland, and the United States (Alaska). Polar bears live on icy areas of land, but they also spend a great deal of their time in the cold waters of the ocean.
Polar bears are one of the largest land mammals. An adult male is about 8 - 10 feet long and weighs between 500 - 1,200 pounds. The largest polar bear ever recorded though, weighed 2,209 pounds. That was in 1960.

CAUSE AND EFFECT FOR WINTER
Just before winter, polar bears start to gain weight. This helps them survive the long, dark winter months when they can't find much food.

The SNOWSHOE HARE
While rabbits prefer living in underground burrows, snowshoe hares live above ground in the dense undergrowth of the forests. Snowshoe hares can be found throughout Canada and in the northern parts of the United States. They can live as far north as the Arctic Ocean, and as far south as the Rocky Mountains in New Mexico.
Even though they look similar, hares are not exactly rabbits, but are more like their cousins. Hares are larger than rabbits.
