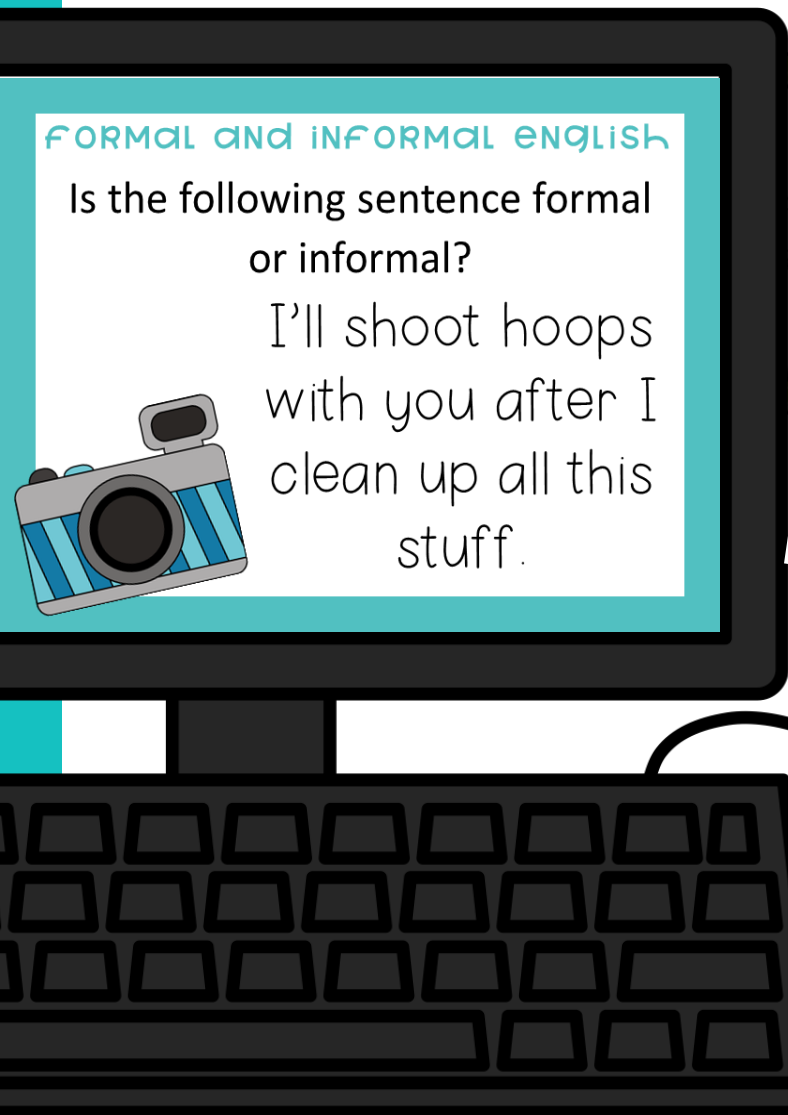

- Formal and Informal English:** "Write F for the Formal sentence and I for the Informal sentence." Example: "A. I was surprised when I saw how many cookies he ate!"

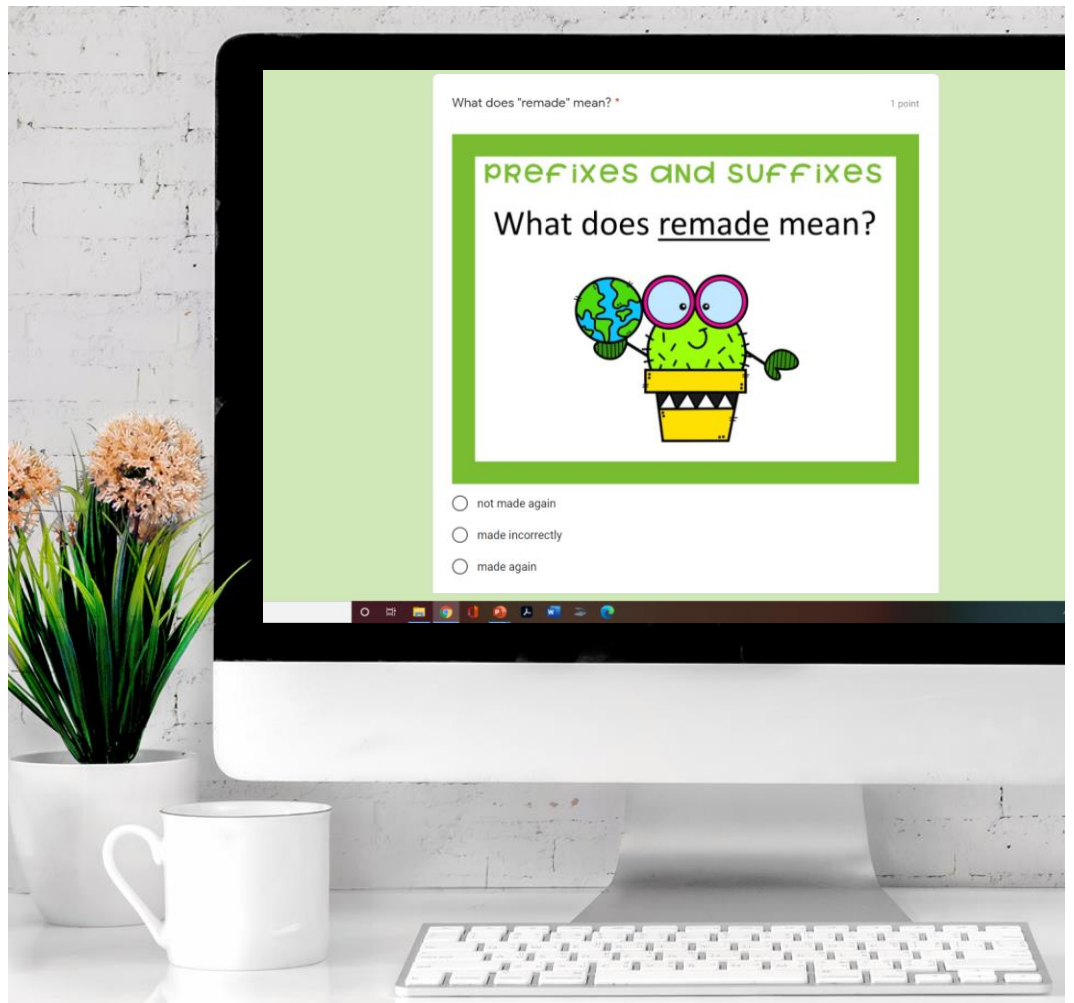

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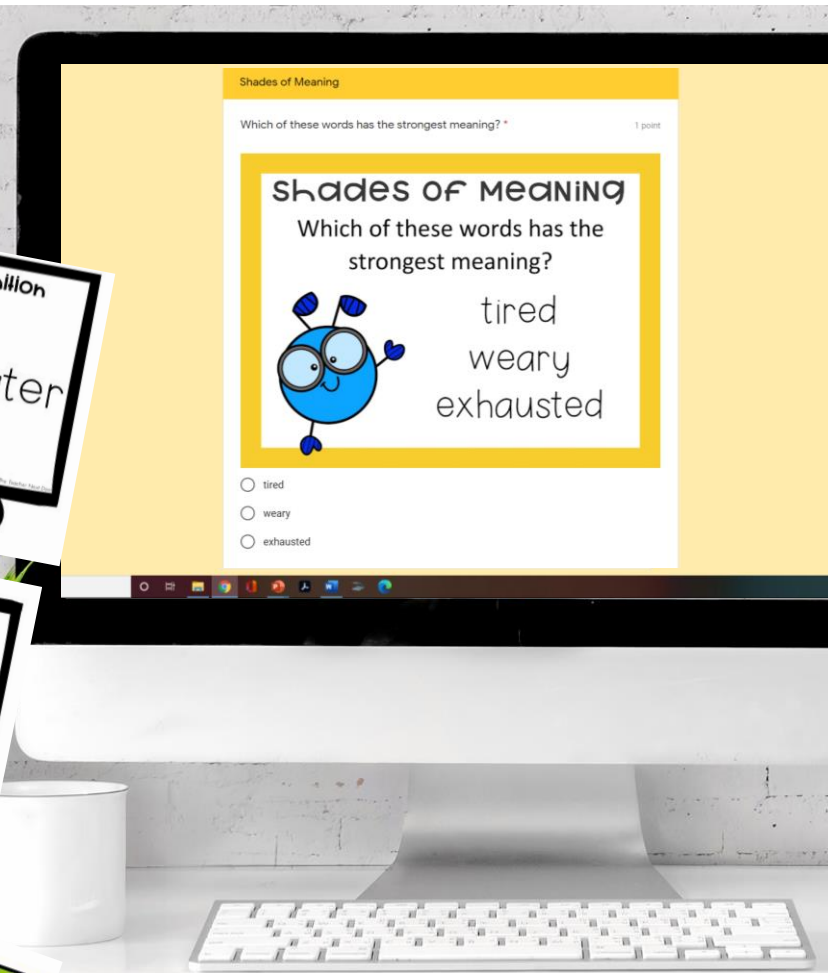
