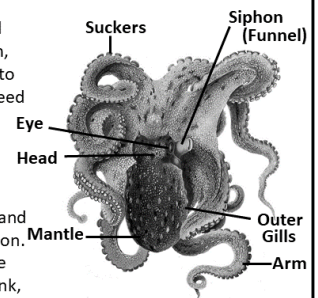

THE OCTOPUS

Octopuses live in oceans around the world. They are plentiful in warm, tropical waters. Most octopuses like to stay on the ocean floor where they feed on crabs, clams, and small fish.

These intelligent creatures have eight arms, each with two rows of suckers. They can move in two ways. Besides crawling, they take in water and squeeze it out of a tube called a siphon. This propels them forward. To escape from predators, they eject a cloudy ink, so they can swim away. They are also able to camouflage themselves by changing their colors.
