

In ancient Egypt, pyramids were built as royal tombs, where ancient Egyptians buried their kings, called Pharaohs, and their royal families. The first pyramid was built about 5,000 years ago and is called the Djoser Pyramid. Today, about 130 pyramids have been discovered. Nearly all Egyptian Pyramids are located on the west bank of the Nile.

Archaeologists have tried to figure out how the pyramids were built without modern machines. They believe that thousands of workers cut large blocks of limestone and then slowly moved the blocks up the pyramid on ramps. As a result, the pyramid was built slowly, one block at a time. For example, scientists estimate it took at least 20,000 workers over 23 years to build the Great Pyramid of Giza. Pharaohs realized how long pyramids took to build and usually started the construction of their
